*Students will:

1. Display critical and distinctly Christian thinking (i.e., engaging in careful thought in order to understand every aspect of life from a Christian worldview) while understanding opposing worldviews.
2. Understand how the Bible develops its themes of creation, fall, and redemption/restoration and understand that these biblical themes inform ones understanding of the history, fine arts, and literature of humankind.
3. Understand that mathematical and scientific concepts are human abstractions of a universe that glorifies God; accordingly, demonstrate competence and wise stewardship in applying mathematical and scientific knowledge to practical problems.
4. Know and understand key historical events and recognize that God providentially directs human history.
5. Be proficient at finding, evaluating and communicating information (e.g., finding information using print resources and information technologies, judging the credibility of sources and content, and communicating information orally and in writing).
6. Develop the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary for life-long learning and for the pursuit of higher education in any institution that will help them to develop their talents most responsibly.
7. Gain significant understanding of other cultures, resulting in the attainment of foundational world language skills, a global and missionary vision of the Church and an appreciation for the complexities of cross-cultural relationships and ministry.
8. Demonstrate a growing relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ, being empowered by the Holy Spirit, governed by God's Word, committed to a local church, and actively engaged in the personal disciplines of prayer, Bible study, corporate worship, service to others, and evangelism.
9. Understand their God-given resources (e.g., talents, abilities, health, possessions, and spiritual gifts) and develop the knowledge, skills, creativity, and Christ-centered identity necessary for responsible stewardship of these assets.
10. Appreciate how human diversity (e.g., socioeconomic, cultural, ethnic, denominational, and gender differences) provides a multifaceted representation of the image of God in humankind and enriches human experience.
